## FROM THE MINISTER'S KEYBOARD

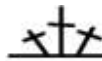


Since the Sunday after first earthquake in Haiti, each Sunday we have lit two candles on Sunday morning. Beside our Christ candle we light a candle for Haiti.

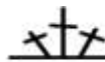

Crowds at the Men's Club Annual Roast Pork Dinner, Feb. 27, 2010



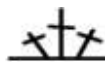

## HOW TO PASS THE OFFERING PLATE

The offering is a practice that dates back to Old Testament times, linking money and personal finance directly to one's identity as a child of God. Giving of one's financial resources is an integral part of a healthy faith life.

*Pay close attention to instructions.*

*Be alert for the plate's arrival at your row or pew.*

Keep an eye on the ushers, if there are any. In most churches, guiding and safeguarding the offering plate is the ushers' job, so wherever they are, so is the plate. As the plate approaches you, be ready to accept it and pass it on.

*Have your offering ready.*

Before arriving at church, think about how much money you can offer. Put your offering in a secure but easy to access place. (Remember, money is not the only gift - some people cannot afford to support the church financially, but may instead share their time and talents.)

*Avoid watching your neighbour or making judgements about their offering.*

Many people contribute once a month by mail and some by automatic withdrawal (pre-authorized remittance, or PAR) from a bank account. If your neighbour passes the plate to you without placing an envelope, cheque, or cash in it, do not assume she or he didn't contribute.

*Be discreet.*

Avoid being showy or obvious about your contribution. For instance, tossing in loonies and toonies to make a cymbal-crashing sound is not necessary. Give humbly and without self-consciousness.

Place your offering in the plate as you pass it politely to the next person.

Do not attempt to make change from the plate if your offering is in cash. Avoid letting the plate rest in your lap as you finish writing a cheque. Simply pass the plate on and hand your cheque to an usher as you leave at the end of worship.

### BE AWARE

Offerings to The United Church of Canada are tax deductible. Consider making your offering by cheque, envelope (guest envelopes are located in the pews) or automatic withdrawal; you will receive a statement from your church at the end of the year.

Offerings can be divided between money designated to support the local congregation and building and money that becomes part of The United Church of Canada's Mission and Service Fund. The M&S Fund pays for much of the United Church's work in Canada and abroad.

If you are a member, resolve to work yourself toward tithing as a putting-your-money-where-your-mouth-is expression of faith. ("Tithe" means "one-tenth"; tithing

refers to the practice of giving 10 percent of one's income to support God's work through the church.)

Everyone, regardless of his or her age, has something to offer. Offerings are not fees or dues given out of obligation. They are gifts of thanksgiving returned to God from the heart.

The traditional plate does not have the aerodynamic qualities of a Frisbee. This has been tested, and is a scientific fact. You do not need to research this point any further. Trust me.

### What is PAR?



PAR or Pre-Authorized Remittance, is a program administered by The United Church of Canada that allows you to contribute to Wesley Memorial through a monthly withdrawal from your bank. If you are not on PAR for your offering, why not consider it? Information pamphlets are available at the back of the sanctuary. If you have any questions, call the church office (382-4180). PAR is a great opportunity for those whose church attendance is other than weekly but wish to contribute regularly to support the church.

**Donations made to the church receive an official receipt for income tax purposes.**

### Offering envelopes

For those who wish to contribute to the church through the weekly offering, church offering envelopes are available through the church office. Post-dated cheques are another option.

### Memorial Cards

For those wishing to make a donation in memory of a loved one, Wesley Memorial United Church Memorial Cards are available through the church office, at the back of the sanctuary and at local funeral homes. Instructions on how to fill out the card and make a donation are noted on the card.

## MISSION OUTREACH



MISSION AND SERVICE FUND

A big thank you to all who supported the Mission and Service Fund during the past year. Our 2009 objective of \$31,000 was attained. Our objective for 2010 will remain the same at \$31,000.

To date, United Church folks have contributed over \$2.5 million to the special **Haitian Earthquake Appeal**. The response of the United Church to this disaster has been overwhelming.



**April 18** has been designated as **World Development and Relief Sunday** this year. We hope the entire congregation will be generous in supporting this effort. All money received counts towards our total Mission and Service Fund objective but it is used totally for World Development projects in Third World countries and for Relief in

times of disasters wherever the need arises throughout the world. Watch for our mailing coming soon.



## PASTORAL CARE

Our focus in December was on the sick/shut-ins from the church. The congregation delivered 45 Christmas remembrance baskets and cards before Christmas. A special thank you to Nancy Courteau for organizing the baskets and to the deliverers. A donation from the Benevolent Fund was made to The Salvation Army for their Christmas food-box campaign.

## VISION PATH



### AGM Update- 2010

The VU Committee has been very busy this year with bi-weekly meetings working toward our joint future as a new

congregation. In addition to these meetings, we were very fortunate to be able to get Rob Dalgleish, from the General Council Office in Toronto, to lead a workshop on Vision in a changing society on January 30 at Wesley then a joint service on January 31 at Mountain View.

Those of you who attended the workshop will remember the excitement and the Spirit's movement throughout the day. For those of you who were unable to attend, here are some of the recurring Visionary themes expressed by attendees:

- Team ministry – target youth, seniors
- Inclusive of all community members at all times, ex. Shift workers, services not just on Sunday
- Multiple and varied services (different types of services, different times and days of week)
- Strong outreach programs
- Strong pastoral care, visitations
- More and varied music (youth choir, instrumental, traditional and contemporary)
- Developing membership/meeting community needs
- Open to be led by the Spirit
- Meet needs of current (older) members and new (young) members
- New building should act as a community centre, ex. Day care centre and/or retirement home attached to the church
- Multi-purpose facility that is environmentally friendly
- Accessible facility, on one level, with good parking
- Use technology, ex. TGIF (Twitter, Google, Internet, and Facebook), large screens, closed circuit video, etc.
- Large kitchen, suitable for catering and supporting outreach programs, ex. Sunday dinner

In the coming weeks and months, the Visioning Subcommittee will be working with the 4 congregations to meld these themes into an inspirational Vision that will not only speak to who we are, but to the people whom God is calling us to be. To this end, there will be a Visioning forum on March 18, a Youth related Vision workshop on March 27, with a follow up workshop to "test drive" the Vision (stay tuned for details). We will be aided in this process by having access to Environics data (census based statistical, demographic and social value information) for our current congregations and for the people living in North West Moncton, where we hope our new congregation will be born.

A wonderful beginning to our future together was the joint service on January 31, led by Rob Dalgleish. There were over 50 people in the choir, over 200 in the congregation, a powerful message from Rob, and the

Spirit in our midst. By the way, if Mountain View needs any roofing work in 2010, this service might be partially responsible as the roof was definitely lifted by our worship.

The blessing is that, as great as it was, this service was only the beginning. Pam Harrison, our Presbytery rep, has advised us that based on our current congregations, our new congregation could have an average attendance of 300+, 569 offering envelopes, and almost \$700,000 of annual givings. The Worship and Events subcommittee will be co-ordinating more joint services and social events with the different church committees in the coming weeks and months.

In case there are any concerns that VU is too heavenly minded to be of much earthly good, we want to advise everyone that there is a Temporary Location Committee (TLC for short). TLC will be scouting for "rental" properties for our use while we are repurposing our current facilities and establishing our long term needs. The New Building Committee will be working over the longer term to ensure that our "permanent" home supports the long term needs of our Vision and Mission. Last, but definitely not least, a Financial Planning Subcommittee will be formed to ensure that fiscal challenges don't become insurmountable obstacles to our Vision and Mission.

The Communications subcommittee has been working over the past few months to keep everyone in the local United Church informed of the progress of the VU. While we have yet to find one method of reaching everyone, we will use multiple methods like bulletin boards in each church, monthly bulletin inserts, emails to church email lists, Facebook (search for Visions United), and our website ([www.visionsunited.ca](http://www.visionsunited.ca)). In our continuing efforts to maintain honest and open communication, a summary of the recent town hall minutes, the subcommittees' roles and members, and a tentative "Congregation Creation" plan either are, or soon will be, available at the sources mentioned above. Additionally, for notices of meetings at which a vote will be held, advance mailings will be sent out to all on the church mailing lists.

Speaking of a vote, VU will be seeking a vote of confidence on the Vision, Mission, and path toward the creation of a new congregation. The VU and subcommittees will be working very hard to provide you with all necessary information by May 1 in preparation for the May 16, 2010 vote.

We ask you to put some "sweat equity" into our joint future- your help is needed. There is far too much work for any small group to do. Whether you can help or not, please pray that we may have the Faith, wisdom, strength and patience to follow where God has called us.
